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The South Australian Postgraduate Medical Education Association (SAPMEA) is a not-for-profit medical education organisation established in South Australia in 1897.

SAPMEA has an extensive and rich history as a leader in innovation and excellence in lifelong education, training and professional support for medical and health professionals.

Our History

SAPMEA traces its history back to 1897 as the first Permanent Committee of the British Medical Association. By 1928, that Committee had reconstituted to become the Postgraduate Committee in Medicine of the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Adelaide, with the University assuming responsibility for the Committee's administration, salaries and funding. The first postgraduate course in medicine was planned for 1930.

In 1975, as the new Medical School at Flinders University was being established, moves were made to expand the Postgraduate Committee in Medicine of the University of Adelaide to incorporate future postgraduate activities of Flinders University.

In 1976, the Postgraduate Committee became incorporated as the South Australian Postgraduate Medical Education Association (SAPMEA). Foundation members of SAPMEA included nominees of the Minister of Health, the two Universities, the Medical Board of South Australia, and the Australian Medical Association (SA).

SAPMEA has continued to evolve and refine our medical education in response to continuing education needs and the everchanging South Australian healthcare landscape.

From delivering a humble single program in 1930, we have expanded to having delivered 74 education workshops across 9 programs in 2021. Today, SAPMEA is proud to have had over 1960 healthcare professionals enrolled in our 2021 education programs.

SAPMEA delivers education programs in a range of modalities that are aligned with all categories of the Medical Board of Australia's CPD framework for medical practitioners.

In keeping at the forefront of education innovation, we have focused and invested in virtual and hybrid learning modalities. In 2021, SAPMEA established itself as the first ECHO Hub in South Australia to deliver the Project ECHO (Extension for Community Healthcare Outcomes) model to our local healthcare workforce. This connects SAPMEA with an international network of over 600 Hubs delivering the virtual learning and professional mentorship ECHO model.

We have health professionals from across metropolitan and regional South Australia participate in our education programs. Our education participants are predominantly general practitioners (GPs), with also strong engagement from nurses, pharmacists, physiotherapists and allied health professionals.

SAPMEA is proud to have a strong following of over 2000 doctors and healthcare professionals subscribing to our fortnightly newsletter. Our social media presence continues to grow through Facebook and LinkedIn.
